THE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION (RESIDENT HUNTING) REGULATIONS, 2021

PART I PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

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1. These Regulations may be cited as the Wildlife Conservation (Resident Hunting) Regulations 2021.

Interpretation

2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires-

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"Act" means the Wildlife Conservation Act;

"authorized officer" shall have the meaning ascribed to it under the Act;

"designated areas" means an area set aside for resident and subsistence hunting activities;

"hunting term" means specified period of one year within which a resident hunting company may conduct hunting activities;

"hunting crew" means clients, resident hunting guide, tracker, skinner and driver;

"meat" has the meaning ascribed to it under the Act;

"observer" means a person accompanying resident hunter for the purposes of viewing hunting exercise;

"prescribed fee" in relation to a licence for hunting of animal, means the fee prescribed in the Third and Fourth Schedules to these Regulations in relation to such animal;

"resident" means a person ordinarily resident in the United Republic of Tanzania;

"resident hunting" means hunting for meat by citizens and

resident non-citizens;

- "resident hunting company" means a registered company dealing with resident hunting activities;
- "resident hunting guide" means a person qualified and licensed by the Conservation Commissioner to guide a resident hunter during a resident hunting expedition;
- "resident hunting guide fee" means a sum of money paid by a resident hunting or hunting company for the purpose of permitting guiding of resident hunting clients:
- "resident hunting licence" means a licence issued to a resident hunting company to operate resident hunting activities in designated areas;
- "resident hunting permit" means a permit issued to a resident hunter through a resident hunting company;
- "resident hunter" is a client of the resident hunting company;
- "resident non citizen" means a person holding a resident permit which allows him to reside in Tanzania for a period of not less than one year;
- "subsistence hunting" means hunting by traditional communities for purposes of domestic consumption;
- "licensing officer" has the meaning ascribed to it under the Act:

PART II

DESIGNATED AREAS FOR RESIDENT HUNTING, ADMINISTRATION AND PROCEDURE FOR APPLICATION AND GRANT

OF RESIDENT HUNTING LICENCE

Designation of areas for resident hunting

3. The Minister may designate areas where resident hunting activities shall be conducted.

Allocation of designated resident hunting areas

- 4.-(1) The Conservation Commissioner shall advertise designated resident hunting areas.
- (2) Applications for allocation of resident hunting areas shall be made in the form prescribed in the First Schedule

- (3) The Conservation Commissioner shall allocate designated areas for resident hunting to successful resident hunting companies.
- (4) The Conservation Commissioner shall issue designated area certificate of allocation to the resident hunting company as prescribed in the Second Schedule.

Issuance of resident hunting licence

- 5.-(1) The Conservation Commissioner shall, two months prior to the end of a hunting term, advertise vacant areas in designated resident hunting areas and invite applications for allocation.
- (2) The application made under regulation 4 and subregulation 5 (1) shall be submitted to the Conservation Commissioner, and be accompanied with-
 - (a) a copy of the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the resident hunting company;
 - (b) a copy of the certificate of incorporation;
 - (c) TIN Certificate or VAT Registration number; and
 - (d) an application fee.
- (3) The applications submitted to the Conservation Commissioner under sub regulation (2) shall be assessed basing on the following criteria-
 - (a) having a suitable office premises for carrying on the resident hunting business;
 - (a) having access of at least one 4WD model pick up vehicle in good running condition;
 - (b) proof of reliable communication facilities;
 - (c) at least two tents;
 - (e) at least one refrigerator and one freezer.

Tenure of ownership

6. (1) The tenure of ownership of designated resident hunting area shall be three years.

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- (2) The resident hunting season shall be in accordance with the Wildlife Conservation Act.
- (3) The Conservation Commissioner shall cause an in-depth analysis of the performance of all resident hunting companies at the resident hunting term in order to determine the eligibility of the renewal at the end of the term.
 - (4) Unless the term for conducting resident hunting

activities in a designated resident hunting area is renewed, the resident hunting company shall cease to operate and vacate the designated resident hunting area at the end of each hunting term.

- (5) The Conservation Commissioner may cancel or suspend a certificate of allocation of resident hunting designated area where the owner of such designated area contravenes any provision of the Act or regulations.
- (6) The Conservation Commissioner shall not exercises powers conferred to him under sub regulation (5) unless he has given the resident hunting company an opportunity to be heard.

Management and supervision of resident hunting activities 7. The Conservation Commissioner shall, in collaboration with District Councils manage and supervise resident hunting activities in the designated areas for resident hunting.

Application for hunting permit

- 8.-(1) Any person intending to conduct resident hunting shall apply for a hunting permit to the Conservation Commissioner through a resident hunting company.
- (2) Applications for resident hunting permits shall be made in the prescribed form set out in the Third Schedule to these Regulations.

Qualification for and issuance of resident hunting permit

- 9.-(1) A the resident hunting permit shall be issued to an applicant by the licensing officer in accordance with the animal *quota* allocated by the Conservation Commissioner to the designated areas for resident hunting.
- (2) Every resident hunting permit shall be in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (3) The licensing officer shall issue a resident hunting permit upon application and payment of nonrefundable fees prescribed in the Fifth Schedule and Sixth Schedule.
- (4) Resident hunting packages shall stipulate types and numbers of animals to be hunted as set forth in a form prescribed in Seventh Schedule.

- (5) Hunting shall only be permitted between 6.00 am and 6.00 pm.
- (6) Any permit holder shall adhere to the conditions attached to the permit issued.

Conditions for granting resident hunting permit

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- 10. The Conservation Commissioner shall, in granting a resident hunting permit to a resident hunting company, have regard to the following-
 - (a) that resident hunting company has a resident hunting guide who holds a valid fire arms license;
 - (b) that the resident hunting guide has a suitable weapon as per the Wildlife Conservation Act;
 - (c) that the applicant has not been convicted of any offence under the Act; and
 - (d) that the resident hunting guide possesses a valid resident hunting guide identity card in the form prescribed in the Eighth Schedule to these Regulations.

Characteristics of holder of resident hunting

- 11.-(1) A resident hunting permit shall authorise the holder to hunt animals, birds or both as specified in the permit.
- (2) The resident hunting permit shall be valid for a period specified therein from the date of issuance.
- (3) A holder of resident hunting permit shall not be entitled to a refund from the Conservation Commissioner resulting for non-utilization of the permit.
- (4) A resident hunting permit issued under these Regulations shall not be transferable.

Condition for holder of resident hunting permit

- 12.-(1) A holder of a resident hunting permit shall comply with the following conditions-
 - (a) that the permit holder complies with the provisions of section 45(4) of the Act;
 - (b) not to be accompanied by more than four casual laborers who shall be citizens;
 - (c) in the case of resident citizen hunters and resident citizen observers, to carry their identity cards recognized by any applicable law during

hunting expedition;

- (d) in the case of resident non citizen hunters and resident non-citizen observers, to carry their working permit during any hunting expedition;
- (e) leaving the areas clean where hunting activities are conducted;
- (f) being accompanied by an authorized officer; and
- (g) reporting to nearest authorized officer at the points of entry and exit as indicated in the licence prior and after the hunt.

Traditional community

- 13.-(1) Traditional communities shall be allowed to hunt in their respective areas and the Director General shall monitor and control hunting of specific species.
- (2) For the purpose of these Regulations, traditional communities are Wahadzabe residing in Mbulu and Iramba District and Wandorobo residing in Simanjiro and Kiteto District.

Surrender of resident hunting permit

- 14.-(1) A permit holder shall return the permit to the licensing officer within a period of thirty days after the date of its expiry.
- (2) Every licensing officer shall submit to the Conservation Commissioner copies of all the resident hunting permits issued within his jurisdiction after the expiry of a particular hunting season.

Issuance of identity card to resident hunting guide

- 15.-(1) A resident hunting guide's identity card shall be issued to a citizen who has passed a resident hunting guide examination.
- (2) A resident hunting guide's identity card shall be in the form prescribed in the Eighth Schedule to these Regulations.

Resident hunting guide to carry identity card

- 16.-(1) Every resident hunting guide shall be required to carry his identity card whenever he is on a hunting expedition.
- (2) Any person who contravenes subregulation (1) commits an offence and shall upon conviction be liable to a

fine of two hundred thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term of six months or to both.

(3) The Conservation Commissioner may compound an offence under subregulation (1) in accordance with the Act.

Loss of identity card

lost-

- 17. Where a resident hunting guide's identity card is
- (a) the owner shall forthwith report the loss to the police; and
- (b) submit the police loss report for application of a new identity card to the Conservation Commissioner who may authorise the licensing officer to issue another identity card.

Hunting crew and observers

- 18.-(1) A holder of a resident hunting permit shall have the right to be accompanied with a hunting crew not exceeding eight persons.
- (2) Subject to sub regulation (1), detailed particulars of the hunting crew shall be submitted to the Conservation Commissioner.
- (3) The hunting crew shall camp in the allocated camping sites within designated resident hunting areas.
- (4) A hunting permit may allow not more than four observers.
- (5) Observers shall be required to pay observer fee as prescribed in the Sixth Schedule.

Determination of hunting *quota*

- 19.-(1) The Conservation Commissioner shall, after receiving advice from a Hunting *Quota* Committee established under section 44(2) of the Act, set a resident hunting quota to be utilized in a particular hunting season in designated hunting areas.
- (2) A resident hunting company shall be issued with resident hunting *quota* and shall adhere to the hunting *quota* allocated.

Application for renewal of term of designated areas 20.-(1) The Conservation Commissioner shall invite submission of applications from a resident hunting company which intends to renew the term of ownership of the

resident hunting designated area.

(2) The application for renewal of the term under sub regulation (1) shall be made in the prescribed form set out in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

Handling of trophies

- 21. (1) Every resident hunting company shall-
- (a) be accompanied by skinners who shall ensure the animal is properly skinned and the skin together with any other trophies are salted, appropriately dried and kept properly;
- (b) unless it obtains a trophy ownership certificate, surrender within thirty days, the skin together with any other trophies except meat to the licensing officer who issued the permit or registered taxidermy; and
- (c) be accompanied by trackers who shall lead hunters in tracking Animals.
- (2) A licensing officer shall, upon obtaining a written approval from the Director, dispose-off trophies hunted from resident hunting through a modality to be determined by the Director.
- (3) Any resident hunter who wishes to sell game meat obtained from resident hunting shall comply with other relevant laws.
- (4) A person shall not transfer any trophy derived from an animal hunted animal pursuant to resident hunting permit to a non-citizen without prior approval of the Director and payment of the transfer fees which shall be the difference between the tourist hunting fees and the resident hunting fees for the particular animal.

PART III OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

General Offences

22. Any person who contravenes any provision of these Regulations commits an offence and shall, upon conviction, be liable to a fine of not less than one million shillings but not exceeding five million shillings or to imprisonment for a term of not less than two years but not exceeding five years or to both.

PART IV MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Benefit sharing

- 23. The revenue accrued from hunting in the designated areas except Game Reserves, Controlled Areas and Wildlife Management Areas shall be distributed as follows:
 - (a) seventy five percent shall be directed to the Conservation Commissioner; and
 - (b) twenty five percent shall be directed to the District Council of the respective area.

Guidelines

- 24.-(1) The Conservation Commissioner may issue guidelines in regard to-
 - (a) resident hunting guide's examination, stipulating the mode of application for the examination by the applicants, setting and making of the examination, release of the results and the issuance of the identity cards to successful candidates;
 - (b) prescribing the modalities for the distribution of the economic benefits accrued by the hunter from resident hunting and the welfare to the community; and
 - (c) better implementation of these Regulations.

Appeal

- 25.-(1) Any person aggrieved by the decision of the Conservation Commissioner may, within thirty days upon the receipt of such decision, appeal to the Minister.
- (2) The Minister shall determine the appeal and issue his decision on the appeal within thirty days from the date of lodging the appeal.
- (3) A person who is further aggrieved by the decision of the Minister may seek redress to the High Court.

Repeal of GN No.229 of 2010

26. The Wildlife Conservation (Resident Hunting) Regulations 2010 are hereby repealed.
